## Conversational Hebrew Beginners

### Level I

Whether you are interested in learning how to speak Hebrew for travel, business or personal pleasure and growth, this class focuses on simple spoken Hebrew. The lessons are planned for students with little or no knowledge of conversational Hebrew or the aleph-bet.

### Level II

This class is designed for students who have some basic knowledge of conversational Hebrew. The course helps students build on that knowledge in order to develop stronger comprehension and language skills to converse more fluently in Hebrew.

### Intermediate Conversational

For students who have completed Beginners Hebrew, this class continues in the same text with an emphasis on more conversation, use of correct grammar and vocabulary enrichment.
